Dear Parents and Carers,

Thank you for your ongoing support and words of encouragement over the last few weeks. It's been an extremely difficult period for everyone so we really appreciate you taking the time to forward these kind words. We're striving to provide pupils with the best ongoing provision possible, both from an academic perspective and in terms of their wider holistic development. For parents to recognise the work of staff in adapting to the current situation to is greatly appreciated.

Parents will know that our expectation is for pupils to follow their normal school timetable, logging into Teams to take part in interactive sessions and complete work set on a lesson by lesson basis. We have set curriculum criteria for this half term and pupils will be set assignments through Teams to allow them to pull their learning together over the next few weeks. This week we also issued our second Enrichment Bulletin which provides pupils with a wider range of learning and enrichment opportunities to extend our academic offer and these focus on aspects we would usually deliver in school but are, for obvious reasons, unable to do so at this time. This document also provides links to resources that can help support the wellbeing of our pupils during what is likely to be a troubling and confusing time for them.

One strand of our enrichment provision is our careers information and guidance. Parents will know that we've already made remote careers appointments available to our pupils, but next week we are pleased to be able to offer our first Penketh High School virtual careers day on Wednesday 6th May. All information is being sent out to pupils on Teams. The programme for the day has been attached to this letter for your information.

You can register ahead of Wednesday's event by watching the test video, this will save time on the day. The day will consist of sessions from local colleges and employers as well as universities and we hope this is the starting point for a discussion about our students' next steps. Later in the year we will be asking pupils to choose their career cluster for next year and so experiences such as those available to pupils on Wednesday and future events will help inform their choices. Prizes, such as £10 and £20 vouchers, will be available throughout the day and make sure you watch out for the quiz at the end.
