Literacy outcomes

At the point of school closure, 74% of pupils were working at or above average.

Numeracy outcomes

At the point of school closure, 44% were working at or above average.

Catch up funding 2020-2021

Data will be analysed from KS2 SATS information received and new pupils will be tested to ascertain their levels of ability in literacy and numeracy using CATs assessments. As always, we will ensure that pupils who need intervention support in literacy and numeracy will obtain a targeted package of support.

A planned intervention programme is already in place and will be implemented to support and enable pupils who have literacy and numeracy difficulties next year.
