Dear Parents and Carers,

As the year draws to a close, it's extremely important for us to be able to reflect on the successes of our outstanding young people. It's been fantastic over the last couple of weeks to be able to take the time to celebrate the successes of our young people during both our Awards Evening but also during our end of year results days with all year groups this week.

Crucially, we've been able to celebrate the academic achievements of young people and the wonderful outcomes they have achieved as a result of their dedication to their studies across the year, but also their broader achievements in the arts, sports and other areas of extra-curricular activities in which they've developed beyond the classroom. I'd like to thank parents for sending across details of their children's achievements outside of school, it's been wonderful to recognise these things with pupils and for them to get the well-deserved plaudits from their year groups during assemblies.

We've once again been delighted with how pupils have engaged with school this year and the fact that 99% of all learning scores represent good or excellent engagement in the classroom serves to demonstrate the extent to which pupils have positively engaged with their studies. We've asked pupils to reflect on their year over the summer and think about the extent to which their engagement this year has reflected the outcomes that they have achieved. Pupils have commented that they recognise why the high expectations we hold are in place and they can see themselves that those who engage with the things that we expect have performed well and secured strong academic outcomes.

We were asked if a key worker who supports pupils in other schools could come and observe our practice. We were delighted with the feedback we received









received and I thought that parents would like to hear to positive things that were said about pupils and our school community;

"Firstly, I want to thank you for the opportunity to spend the day at your school and observe the routines and pedagogical strategies in place. It was amazing to witness the positive culture and atmosphere at the school...While walking through the corridors of your school, I was struck by the positive atmosphere and the respect and connection the students had with the teachers. In my classroom observations, I noted an environment very conducive to learning.

In the afternoon, I learned that school finishes at 2:30 pm at Penketh High. Initially, I wondered why it ended so early, but I was informed that students have 45 minutes of enrichment activities afterward. I found this to be a truly wonderful idea that I plan to take back to the schools I work with. The variety of activities offered provides students with opportunities to explore different interests.

Visiting Penketh High School showed me that the school truly values improving students' life chances on all fronts. Moreover, my visit provided me with an enlightening perspective that students' life chances are not solely determined by their backgrounds and that in fact, schools can improve students life chances through putting good academic and social development systems in place."

Parents, I'm sure, will be aware of the range of trips, experiences and wider learning opportunities that staff have provided for pupils over the last few months. We're delighted to be able to offer pupils the chance to extend their learning and broaden their horizons and the attached newsletter will provide parents with an insight into what pupils have been up to.

I'd like to thank staff for taking the time to plan and deliver these experiences for pupils, often at the expense of time with their own families. I'm aware of how committed and dedicated the staff are and that they are determined to ensure that our young people get the best possible experiences during their time at school.

I'd also like to thank parents for their continued support. We're always grateful for the wonderful messages of thanks and support that we receive throughout the year. It's the collaboration between home and school and the understanding from parents about what we want to achieve and provide for your young people that helps us to drive improvement on behalf of pupils. We have a shared goal for our pupils and your children which is for them to be successful during their time at school and beyond as they pursue lifelong success, so working in collaboration to help them achieve this is built on strong home-school relationships.

We are looking forward to another exciting year ahead, but I would like to wish our pupils and their families all the very best for the summer break and we look forward to seeing pupils in September when we return to school.
